We are excited to be staging the updated version of the show with new songs from Stiles and Drew (Honk!, Betty Blue Eyes and additional songs for the stage version of Mary Poppins) and book by Julian Fellowes (Downton Abbey) which premiered at Chichester Festival Theatre in 2016 before a successful London transfer.

ABOUT THE SHOW

KIPPS - The New Half A Sixpence Musical is a musical adaptation of H.G. Wells's disguised autobiographical novel Kipps: The Story Of A Simple Soul, based on his unhappy apprenticeship as a draper at Hyde's Drapery Emporium in Southsea.

Arthur Kipps, an orphan, is an overworked draper's assistant at Shalford's Bazaar, Folkestone, at the turn of the last century. He is a charming but ordinary young man who, along with his fellow apprentices, dreams of a better and more fulfilling world, but he likes his fun just like any other, except not quite.

When Kipps unexpectedly inherits a fortune that propels him into high society, it confuses everything he thought he knew about life. Watching him wrestle with his new identity is his childhood companion and not-quite girlfriend, Ann Pornick, who sees with dismay how Arthur is being made over in a new image by the beautiful and classy Helen Walsingham. She is always there with helpful hints on how Arthur could improve himself and make his life richer and more meaningful, if only he would believe in himself, and listen to her. Both of these young women love Arthur – there is no doubt about that – but which should he listen to? With the help of his friends, Arthur learns that if you want to have the chance of living the right life, you need to make the right choices.

PERFORMANCE VENUE

It is vital that cast members must attend all these dates.

REHEARSALS

A full rehearsal schedule will be sent out once the show is cast. Rehearsals take place on a Monday evening (7.45pm-10.00pm at St Hilda's Church Hall) and on a Wednesday evening (times and venue tbc). There will be additional Sunday rehearsals from October, also at St Hilda's Church Hall. A list of rehearsal dates can be found on our website.

You will not be called for all rehearsals! If you are aware that you are unable to make certain dates, please acknowledge this on your audition form. We will do our best to work around planned absences as much as possible.

MEMBERSHIP AND SHOW FEES

Annual membership to Hatton Musical Theatre is £20 (£15 Junior). This is to be paid immediately upon starting rehearsals. A show fee of £120 is payable for this production. AUDITIONS - SATURDAY 7 MAY

To be considered for any principal role, you must audition. Those who do not wish to be considered for any ensemble speaking or singing roles do not have to audition for the panel, but we still need you to fill in the online audition form to indicate that you wish to take part in the show. Please ensure that you inform us of **all** roles you wish to be considered for.

Auditions will take place on Saturday 7 May at **St Hilda's Church** (1.00pm-5.00pm). You will be able to select your preferred audition time slot on the audition form. We will do our best to accommodate your request, however this may not be possible in all cases. An audition timetable will be shared with you no later than Wednesday 4 May. Please note that these are closed room auditions and only the audition panel will be present in the room. If you would prefer, you can bring one other person into the audition room for support.

If you are unable to make the audition date, please speak to the production team who will do their best to find an alternative solution.

CHARACTERS

Principal roles

Arthur Kipps (Baritone)

Apprentice to Shalfords Bazaar who comes into a fortune, chirpy, sincere, very likable. Strong actor, dancer and singer. (20+).

Ann Pornick (Mezzo-Soprano)

Childhood companion to Arthur, works as a domestic maid, sweet natured, girl next door, working class. Strong mezzo voice required. (20+).

Chitterlow (Baritone)

Actor, playwright and impresario, flamboyant, eccentric showman, takes Arthur under his wing. Strong actor and singer. (40+).

Sid Pornick (Baritone)

Apprentice at Shalford's Bazaar, Ann's brother and a Socialist, feels injustices. Strong character actor (20+).

Pierce (Baritone)

Apprentice at Shalford's Bazaar, A Dandy, show off, fancies himself. Strong singer, able to sing in harmony. (20+).

Buggins (Baritone)

Apprentice at Shalford's Bazaar, A Pessimist, unsure, more dour and earnest than the others. Comedy actor, able to sing in harmony.(20+).

Flo Evans (Mezzo-Soprano)

Head Window Dresser at Shalfords –nice, chirpy, confident. Strong comedy actress required, with good singing ability. (20+).

Helen Walsingham (Soprano)

Educated, classy suitor to Arthur, kind. Strong singing range. Clipped RP. (20+).

Mrs Walsingham (Soprano)

Helen's mother - over-bearing snob. Comedic actress with a strong soprano voice. (50+).

James Walshingham (Baritone)

Helen's brother – financial adviser, a charlatan. Confident singer. (20+)

Lady Punnet (Soprano)

Wealthy friend to the Walshingham's, comes from a privileged background (35+).

Mr Shalford (Baritone)

Proprietor of the store, gruff, proud man. Good singing and acting ability. (50+).



Featured ensemble

Mr Maxwell (Baritone)

An architect (any age).

Photographer (Baritone)

Photographer at the wedding of Ann and Kipps (any age).

Ms/Mr Carshot

Floor-walker at Shalford's Bazaar, dedicated, been doing the same job for years, bit down trodden (any age).

Aunt Susan Kipps and Uncle Bert Kipps

Arthur's Aunt and Uncle – working class, salt of the earth types who own their own little shop (50+).

Lady Dacre/Mrs Bindo-Botting

Wealthy friends of Lady Punnet (40+).

Hayes/Miss Ross

Students at Miss Walshingham's evening class. (any age).

Foster

Lady Punnet's Butler (any age).

Ensemble

Shoppers, Crowd, Party Guests, Policemen, Waiters, Maids, Posh Ladies and Gentlemen, Promenaders, Wedding Party Guests, etc.



AUDITION MATERIAL

We will not have any printouts on audition days so please do print your own copies of whatever you need. Feel free to use an iPad/tablet if you wish.

Please note we are not expecting you to be word perfect for the auditions. We just ask that you come with a knowledge and understanding of the song and show us lots of character!
